2. Harry Sinclair Lewis was a famous American novelist, short story writer and playwright. He was the first writer from the United States to receive the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1930.

## THE HACK DRIVER : SUMMARY IN ENGLISH

The narrator of the story explains that after completing his graduation he started working with a famous law firm in the city. He was working as an assistant clerk there. He was not very happy with his job of serving summons because sometimes he had to face harsh situations while serving them. One day, he got the task of serving summons to Oliver Lutkins who was a key witness in some cases. He lived in a small town named New Mullion.

The narrator was very excited to visit a small and beautiful town but his excitement ended by the dull appearance of the town. He saw a hack driver standing at the platform who was very cheerful and nice. He went up to him and enquired about Oliver Lutkins as he was new to the town and wanted to find him. The driver told him that Oliver was a nasty man who owed debt to many people. He also cunningly extracted information from the lawyer that he needed Lutkins for some court case.

A deal was cracked between both- he decided to hire Bill's hack and go on a search for Lutkins. Bill somehow traps the lawyer in his story and they visit different places in search of Lutkins. He always asks the lawyer to stay behind. They go to Fritz's to catch Lutkins while playing poker. But he tells them that he has gone to Gustaff for a shave. At Gustaff's they weren't able to meet him and were told that someone saw him at the pool room. Here also somebody said that he left the poolroom after buying cigarettes.

Bill described Lutkins as a cunning man and guessed that he must have gone to Gray's for a shave. In the afternoon, Bill offered him to buy lunch from his wife as it would be less costly than at the restaurant. They had lunch at Wade's hill which was a very beautiful place. By that time the clerk was totally impressed by Bill's nice and cheery nature. He had even started comparing village people to city people. Later on, they went to search for Lutkins at his mother's house on the basis of information derived from one of his friends.

There the lady was horrible and they hurriedly left the place as she was about to attack them with a hot iron rod. At last, the lawyer had to leave without serving summons to Lutkins. Next day he was scolded badly by his chief and was again sent to New Mullion with a companion who knew Lutkins. Upon reaching the station, the clerk happily pointed out that Bill was such a helpful person to him.

At this time, the truth was revealed by his companion that the hack driver was none other than Lutkins himself. The clerk felt so bad and ashamed of how he had been fooled by a villager.

The narrator is a junior assistant clerk in a famous law firm in the city. His work is to prepare briefs and serve the summons. He had to go to the dirty corners of the city to serve summons to the victims and was, at times, beaten up by strong people.

He had to go to New Mullion to serve a summon to Oliver Lutkins. At the railway station, he met a forty-year-old, friendly man, who introduced himself as Bill. He claimed to have seen Lutkins an hour ago.

The village streets were muddy, so the lawyer hired the hack for the search of Lutkins. The driver took him all around- to the Fritz, Gustaff's shop, the barber's, and the poolroom. ### THE HACK DRIVER KEY POINTS

1 The Hack Driver is an amusing tale of a young, innocent lawyer who goes to the village to serve a summon to Oliver Lutkins.

2 He meets a man at the railway station, who introduces himself as Bill. Bill said that he knew everyone in the village and promised to look for Oliver Lutkins.

3 He takes the lawyer to several places to look for Lutkins and extracts a lot of money from him. After a long search, they could not find Lutkins.

4 The following day, the lawyer and his colleague go to the village and come to know that the driver was Lutkins. Everyone was laughing at the lawyer as he felt ashamed of himself.

5 THEME- The lesson talks about a character who was duped. He should have been careful and should not have taken his work for granted. The world is full of fraudsters and imposters. He was easily tricked and fooled by villagers, where he had least doubts. He wasn't cheated personally even financially as well. He spent his day roaming around with a trickster who turned out to be the same at the end.

6 MESSAGE- A young lawyer went to a village to serve a summons on Oliver Lutkins. He met Bill who fooled him and made him believe that he was helping him. He took him to various places in search of Lutkins and everywhere he pretended that Lutkins had just left that place. Convinced himself that someone tried to help him but failed.

### 1. Oliver Lutkins

He was a fat man of forty years. He was a friendly man. His working clothes were dirty and well-worn. He met the narrator and was convinced that he would be a great help to him. He was paid for the time he would spend in search of Lutkins.

### 2. The narrator

The narrator is definitely a romantic idealist. He is freshman from a law school. He wants to solve a real case. But, as a part of training, he is sent to serve summons. He finds it difficult to understand. He simply dislikes his job as he has to go to all dirty places. Further, he has a very romantic view of the country. He believes that villages are all pure and peaceful.

### 3. The Lawyer -

The lawyer is an innocent, young man. After graduation, he works as an assistant clerk at a famous firm in the city. He is unhappy with his job and does not like city life. He often thinks about running away. He is a gullible person. He easily trusts Bill and is easily fooled by him. He is rather naive for trusting a stranger he met at the railway station.

Ans. Oliver Lutkins, 'the Hack Driver' comes across as a clever person who has little consideration for others and exploits their gullibility to his convenience. He cheats the lawyer on the pretext of helping him in locating Lutkins and thereby extracts money from him in an unfair manner. The fact that he laughs at him the following day when the lawyer delivers the summon, shows that he lacks consideration and does not repent his action. He seems to have little respect for law as he has disobeyed the earlier summons. But the narrator also depicts him as a person with a sense of humor that one almost forgives his tricks as a practical joke.

2. How did the narrator get to know about Bill's reality?

Ans. Bill was a witness in a case. The narrator was sent by his firm to serve summons to Lutkins at New Mullion. The narrator could not identify him as he had never met him before. The fun-loving Lutkins took advantage of the narrator's ignorance and befooled him. He introduced

himself as Bill and offered to him find Lutkins. He took him all around the village but with no success. Satisfied with Bill's help, the narrator returned without serving the summon.

Next morning he visited New Mullions again with a man who knew Lutkins by face. At the station the lawyer saw Bill talking to Lutkins' mother in a friendly manner. The lawyer was surprised to know from his companion that Bill was no other man than Lutkins himself.

3. Why do you think Lutkins' neighbors were anxious to meet the lawyer?

Ans. The lawyer was sent to serve summons to Lutkins at New Mullion. Bill had befooled the lawyer by taking him all over the village and posing that he was helping him in his search for Lutkins. The villagers knew the reality that he was having fun and befooling the lawyer by not revealing his real identity. They also joined him in the fun as they were part of their meeting.
