

Asokamitran (22 September 1931-23 March 2017) was a famous Tamil writer and Sahitya Akademi winner. He wrote 8 novels, 20 novellas and hundreds of short stories, on a wide range of issues.

'Poets and Pancakes' is an excerpt from his autobiographical book 'My Years with Boss' which comically describes the functioning of Gemini Studios of Chennai where he was working as a clerk.

### III. SOME IMPORTANT NOTES

1. **GEMINI STUDIOS-** Gemini Studios was an Indian film studio in Madras, Tamil Nadu.formerly, It was known as Motion Picture Producers' Combines. Later S. S. Vasan bought it from Krishnaswamy Subrahmanyam and renamed it as Gemini Studios.

- 2. MY YEARS WITH BOSS- A book by the Tamil writer Ashokamitran. He recounts his years at Gemini Studios in this book which also talks of the influence of movies on every aspect of life in India.
- **3. CHENNAI-** Capital and the largest city of Tamil Nadu, an Indian state.
- **4. PANCAKE** A pancake is a flat cake cooked on a hot surface like a frying pan.

In this text Pancake is the brand name of the make-up material that Gemini Studios brought in truck-loads.

**5. GRETA GARBO**- Greta Garbo was a Swedish-American actress,regarded as one of the greatest actresses to ever be on screen.



- **6. MISS GOHAR** Gohar Khayyam Mamajiwala was an Indian singer, actress, producer and studio owner.
- 7. VYJAYANTHIMALA- is a former Indian actress, dancer and parliamentarian. She is regarded as the "First Female Superstar" of Hindi cinema.
- **8. RATI AGNIHOTRI** an Indian actress, known for acting in Hindi, as well as in Telugu and Tamil language films.
- **9. ROBERT CLIVE'S STABLE-** Robert Clive was the first British Governor of the Bengal Presidency.

In this text the make-up department of the Gemini Studios was in the upstairs of a building that was believed to have been Robert Clive's stables.

- **10. ST MARY'S CHURCH** Is an Anglican Church in Chennai, formerly known in Madras.
- **11. FORT ST GEORGE** Fort St. George is the first English fortress in India, founded in 1639 at the coastal city of Madras.
- **12. MADRAS** Former name of Chennai, the capital of Tamil Nadu.
- **13. A.I.R.** is the national radio Broadcaster of India.
- **14. DOORDARSHAN** Doordarshan is an autonomous public service broadcaster founded by the Government of India,

- **15. INDOOR SHOOTING** photos or videos taken indoors .The term is hugely used for film -shooting.
- **16. OUTDOOR SHOOTING** photos or videos taken outdoors. It is also widely used for film -shooting.
- **17. CUBICLE-** It is a small space with walls or curtains around it, that is separate from the rest of a room.



- **18. FRENCH WINDOWS** -door-sized windows, which are usually made of wood and glass.
- **19. BRAHMIN** a caste in Hindu society.
- 20. **DEVADASIS** In India, a devadasi was a female artist who was dedicated to worship and serve a deity or a temple for the rest of her life. 25. THE GOD THAT FAILED- -A collection of essays in which Six eminent men of letters in six separate essays described 'their journeys into Communism and their disillusioned return. These men are Andre Gide, Richard Wright, Ignazio Silone, Arthur Koestler, Louis Fischer and Stephen Spender.

# 4. HIERARCHY IN THE MAKE-UP DEPARTMENT

5. **THE OFFICE BOY** - The office boy in the make-up department, there was an office boy who was not really a young boy, but a grown-up man of forty years old .He joined the studio with a dream of becoming a star. But his dreams remained unfulfilled and he blamed Subbu, the no. 2 in Gemini for his failure. He was given the duty of crowd makeup. His job was an easy

one, still he feels he was an expert and a skilled make-up artist.

6. KOTHAMANGALAM SUBBU- He was considered the No.2 at the studio and the most favourite of the boss. Being a brahmin he was given more importance than the office boy. He was a man of many abilities and a kindhearted person. But the office boy did not like him because of his popularity and often cursed him.

He always looked cheerful and was very loyal towards the boss. He was extremely creative and used his talent to his own advantage and to make his position strong in the studio.



#### SUMMARY IN ENGLISH

The essay, "Poets and Pancakes" is an extract from Asokamitran's book "My Years with Boss." It talks about the famous Gemini Studios and the various elements of each department. Here pancakes means the makeup materials used by the actresses in heavy amounts. These pancakes turned decent-looking characters into monsters.

The make-up department was located in a building which was believed to have been Robert Clive's stable. However, there were several buildings associated with Robert Clive's residence. Here the author gives a description of the make-up department as a symbol of national integration as there were workers from various parts of the country such as Bengal, Maharashtra, Madras, Andhra etc.

In the make-up department, there was an office boy who joined the studio with a dream of becoming a star. But his dreams remained unfulfilled and he blamed Subbu, the no. 2 in Gemini for his failure. This Subbu was a man of many abilities and a kind-hearted person. But the office boy did not like him because of his popularity and often cursed him.

The narrator's duty at the studios

was to cut newspaper clippings on several issues and store them in files. However, anyone who saw him tearing newspapers thought he was doing nothing. So, everyone would barge in his cubicle to deliver some lecture or work to him. The office boy, who was a bit of a poet, also began to show his literary talent before him.

Apart from the make-up department there was also a story department. A lawyer who used to be also a legal advisor was a member of this story department. This lawyer caused the end of a brilliant acting career of an extremely talented actress. Eventually, he also lost his job with the closure of the story department.

Gemini Studios was the favourite haunt of some poets who used to wear khadi and believed that Communists were godless men who had no feelings of love and compassion.

Then the author tells us about the visit of the Moral Rearmament Army (MRA) with two hundred strong people. This MRA presented two plays in a very professional manner. These plays became a good success and left their impression on Tamil drama. Later, we come to know that MRA was actually a counter-Communist movement.

Asokamitran also tells us about the visit of an English poet to the studios. The Boss arranged a grand welcome for the poet but the purpose of his arrival remained a mystery to the workers for a long time. They had never heard the poet's name before and they also did not understand what he spoke.Later the author learnt that the name of that poet was Stephen Spender and he was also the editor of the periodical called The Encounter.

Years later when the author retired from the Gemini Studios, he came across a book titled, "The God That Failed". It had six essays, one of which was written by Stephen Spender. Thus the mystery of Spender's visit to Gemini Studios was cleared to the narrator. He assumed that his visit was related to his anti-communist perspective.

### पाठ का सारांश

निबंध, "पोएट्स एंड पेनकेक्स" अशोकिमत्रन की पुस्तक "माई इयर्स विद बॉस" से एक उद्धरण है। लेखक यहां जेमिनी स्टूडियो और उसके प्रत्येक विभाग के विभिन्न तत्वों के बारे में बात करते है। यहां पेनकेक्स का मतलब अभिनेत्रियों द्वारा भारी मात्रा में उपयोग की जाने वाली मेकअप सामग्री का ब्रांड है। यह पेनकेक्स सभ्य दिखने वाले इंसानों को भी राक्षसों में बदल सकता है।

मेकअप विभाग एक ऐसी इमारत में स्थित था जिसके बारे में माना जाता था कि वह रॉबर्ट क्लाइव का अस्तबल था। हालाँकि, रॉबर्ट क्लाइव के निवास से जुड़ी कई इमारतें थीं। यहाँ लेखक राष्ट्रीय एकता के प्रतीक के रूप में मेकअप विभाग का विवरण देता है क्योंकि देश के विभिन्न हिस्सों जैसे बंगाल, महाराष्ट्र, मद्रास, आंध्र आदि से लोग यहां काम करने आते थे।

मेकअप डिपार्टमेंट में ऑफिस बॉय था जो स्टार बनने का सपना लेकर स्टूडियो आया था। लेकिन उनके सपने अधूरे रह गए और उन्होंने अपनी असफलता के लिए जैमिनी के नंबर 2 सुब्बू को जिम्मेदार ठहराया। यह सुब्बू कई योग्यताओं वाला एक दयालु व्यक्ति था। लेकिन ऑफिस बॉय उनकी लोकप्रियता के कारण उन्हें पसंद नहीं करते थे और अक्सर उन्हें श्राप देते थे।

स्टूडियो में कथाकार का काम था अखबारों से विभिन्न मुद्दों को चुनके उससे काटकर फाइलों में संग्रहीत करना। हालांकि, जिसने भी उसे अख़बार फाड़ते हुए देखा, उसने सोचा कि वह कुछ भी नहीं कर रहा है। इसलिए, हर कोई उसे लेक्चर देने या काम देने के लिए उसके कक्ष में घुस जाता था। ऑफिस बॉय, जो थोड़ा हद तक किव भी था, उसने भी लेखक के सामने अपनी साहित्यिक प्रतिभा दिखाना शुरू कर दिया।

मेकअप विभाग के अलावा एक कहानी विभाग भी था। एक वकील जो कानूनी सलाहकार भी हुआ करता था, इस कहानी विभाग का सदस्य था। इस वकील ने एक बेहद प्रतिभाशाली अभिनेत्री के शानदार अभिनय करियर का अंत किया। बाद में, कहानी विभाग के बंद होने से उनकी नौकरी भी चली गई।

जेमिनी स्टूडियो कुछ कवियों का पसंदीदा अड्डा था जो खादी पहनते थे और मानते थे कि कम्युनिस्ट ईश्वरविहीन पुरुष थे जिनमें प्रेम और करुणा की कोई भावना नहीं थी।

फिर लेखक हमें दो सौ मजबूत लोगों के साथ मोरल रिअरमामेंट आर्मी (एमआरए) की आने के बारे में बताते है। इस एमआरए ने दो नाटकों को बहुत ही पेशेवर तरीके से प्रस्तुत किया। ये नाटक एक अच्छी सफलता हासिल किया और तमिल नाटक पर अपनी छाप छोड़ी। बाद में, हमें पता चला कि एमआरए वास्तव में एक कम्युनिस्ट विरोधी आंदोलन था।

अशोकिमत्रन हमें एक अंग्रेजी किव के स्टूडियो में आने के बारे में भी बताते हैं। जैमिनी में किव के लिए एक भव्य स्वागत की व्यवस्था किया गया, लेकिन उनके आने का उद्देश्य लंबे समय तक कर्मचारियों के लिए एक रहस्य बना रहा। उन्होंने पहले कभी किव का नाम नहीं सुना था और उनका भाषा भी इन लोगों को समझ में नहीं आया। बाद में लेखक को पता चला कि उस किव का नाम स्टीफन स्पेंडर था और वह द एनकाउंटर नामक पत्रिका के संपादक भी थे।

वर्षों बाद जब लेखक जेमिनी स्टूडियो से सेवानिवृत्त हुए, तो उन्हें 'द गॉड दैट फेल' नामक एक पुस्तक मिली। इसमें छह निबंध था, जिनमें से एक स्टीफन स्पेंडर द्वारा लिखा गया था। इस प्रकार स्पेंडर की जेमिनी स्टूडियो की यात्रा का रहस्य लेखक के लिए स्पष्ट हो गया। उन्होंने अनुमान लगाया कि किव की यात्रा उनके कम्युनिस्ट विरोधी दृष्टिकोण से संबंधित थी।

He couldn't succeed and was disappointed due to his failure and blamed everything upon Subbu.

Answer: Subbu was a Brahmin with a multi-talented personality. He used to solve each and every problem of Gemini Studios. He was very close to the boss and was always ready to serve him. They presented two plays in the most professional manner. The plays represented simple sermons and the costumes and sets were superb. Their play, 'Jotham Valley" impressed the Tamil theater. They imitated the sunrise and sunset scenes in their manner for years. Though the MRA was anticommunist and the anti-communist feeling existed at the Studios, the coming of the MRA had no impact on the attitude of the bosses; their enterprises went on as usual.
