

INTRODUCTION:

The story 'Should Wizard Hit Mommy?' reveals the worldview of a little child to a difficult moral question that shows her mental or psychological richness. Jo warmly responds to her father's story-telling. But she can't excuse Roger Skunk's mother for making poor little Roger smell bad again. Her hero must smell like roses and must not stink at any cost. So she wants her father to make a little change in the story. She wants him to tell a different story. In that changed version, the wizard takes a magic wand and hits Roger Skunk's mommy.

भूमिका:

कहानी 'क्या जादूगर को माँ को मारना चाहिए?' एक छोटे बच्चे की विश्वदृष्टि को एक कठिन नैतिक प्रश्न के सामने प्रकट करता है जो उसकी मानसिक या मनोवैज्ञानिक समृद्धि को दर्शाता है। जो अपने पिता की कहानी कहने का गर्मजोशी से जवाब देती है। लेकिन वह रोजर स्कंक की मां को गरीब छोटे रोजर की गंध को फिर से खराब करने के लिए माफ नहीं कर सकती। उसके नायक को गुलाब की तरह महकना चाहिए और किसी भी कीमत पर बदबू नहीं करनी चाहिए। इसलिए वह चाहती हैं कि उनके पिता कहानी में थोड़ा बदलाव करें। वह चाहती है कि वह एक अलग कहानी बताए। उस बदले हुए संस्करण में, जादूगर एक जादू की छड़ी लेता है और रोजर स्कंक की माँ को मारता है।

THEME:

The story deals with certain moral issues and with the adult complexes that clash with childish innocence. Father Jack tells stories to his daughter Jo, influenced by his own childhood experiences, failures and complexes. On the other hand, his daughter lives in her own world of fantasy and doesn't want to come out of it. She feels the pain of being rejected by the playmates when Roger Skunk is rejected due to his bad smell. The story highlights the point that the children also have their egos, identities, views and attitude. The ending of the story also highlights the fact that the children must understand that one must accept one's identity and gracefully accept the way we are created by God.

विषयवस्तु:

- 5. Mother Skunk: Mother of baby Skunk.
- 6. Owl: a wise creature that solves the problems.
- 7. Wizard: A magician.

MAIN CHARACTERS:

Jack:

- 1. Jo's father and Clare's husband.
- Does not like women contradicting him and fears that his daughter would also begin contradicting him like his wife.
- 3. Much like Roger Skunk the character in his story in his real life.
- Was bullied at school when he was a child just like Roger Skunk was disliked for his bad smell.
- 5. Dutiful and responsible towards his family.
- 6. Smart and Manipulative as he cleverly changes the plot to regain Jo's attention and also chooses the twist to make Jo understand the meaning of compromise.

Jo:

- Jack and Clare's four-year-old daughter
- 2. Curious by Nature
- 3. Very Interrogative
- 4. Stubborn
- Empathetic as she relates to Roger Skunk's desire to be accepted by other animals.
- A Too innocent and young therefore believes that Roger

- Skunk's mother is the villain of the story.
- 7. Jo's suggestion that the wizard should hit Roger's mother for her misbehavior implies that jo has picked up on the unhappy (and potentially violent) nature of her parent's marriage.

Roger Skunk:

- The protagonist of the story that Jack narrates to Jo.
- 2. He is a little black animal who lives in the dark forest.
- 3. He looks like a squirrel and smells very bad.
- He is bullied for his foul Skunk smell.
- 5. He has no friends.
- 6. He wants nothing more than to play with the other animals.
- 7. His bad smell is changed into a rose smell by the magician.
- 8. He ultimately acquiesces to his mother's wishes and accepts that his smell cannot be changed because it is part of who he is.

Wizard:

- A constant or fixed character in Jack's bedtime stories.
- 2. Gives a solution to Roger's problems in the story.
- 3. Performs magic spells.

 Changes Roger Skunk's foul smell to that of scented roses and later reverses the spell as demanded by Roger Skunk's mother.

SUMMARY:

The story revolves around a father named Jack and his two kids, Bobby and Jo. Jack's wife is Clare. She was bearing the third child of the couple. Thus, to put her daughter to bed, Jack would make up stories for her daughter. This story-telling tradition started when Jo was 2 and thus continued ever since. Jack makes sure that he tells a different story every time and his daughter loves it. However, a small creature was always common, Roger. For instance, it was either Roger Fish or Roger Chipmunk. Roger goes to the wise old owl with problems that would send him to a Wizard. The wizard casts a spell in exchange for a service fee.

The name of the story makes it more interesting. Students will be compelled to think about why a wizard would hit mommy. Jo is growing up and has started to develop her senses. She is making more sense now and her frequency of asking questions has increased a lot. As per the story 'Should Wizard Hit Mommy', Jack told the story of a Skunk named Roger. His problem was that he smelled awful. The skunk went to the wizard to find a proper solution to this problem as no one was coming closer to him. The wizard asks what kind of smell he wanted on his body. The skunk answered that he wanted to smell like roses. The wizard grants his wish and casts a spell to make Roger smell like roses. The skunk then returns to his mom. Jo thought that the story had ended but Jack continued.

कहानी का नाम इसे और दिलचस्प बनाता है। विद्यार्थी यह सोचने पर विवश हो जाएंगे कि कोई जादूगर मम्मी को क्यों मारेगा। जो बड़ी हो रही है और उसने अपनी इंद्रियों को विकसित करना शुरू कर दिया है। वह अब ज्यादा समझदार हो रही है और उसके सवाल पूछने की बारंबारता बहुत बढ़ गई है। 'शोल्ड विजार्ड हिट मॉमी' कहानी के अनुसार जैक ने रोजर नाम के एक बदमाश की कहानी सुनाई। उसकी समस्या यह थी कि उसे भयानक गंध आ रही थी। बदमाश इस समस्या का उचित समाधान खोजने के लिए जादूगर के पास गया क्योंकि कोई भी उसके करीब नहीं आ रहा था। जादूगर पूछता है कि उसे अपने शरीर पर किस तरह की गंध चाहिए। बदमाश ने जवाब दिया कि वह गुलाब की तरह महकना चाहता है। जादूगर उसकी इच्छा को पूरा करता है और रोजर को गुलाब की तरह महकने के लिए जादू करता है। बदमाश फिर अपनी माँ के पास लौट आता है। जो ने सोचा कि कहानी खत्म हो गई है लेकिन जैक ने जारी रखा।

After reaching home, the mummy noticed the awful smell and asked Roger who did this. Roger Skunk told her that he did not like the way he smelled so he asked the Wizard to help him smell like roses. This infuriated the mother and told him to accept himself for what he was. She went to the Wizard all angry and asked him to return the skunk smell after hitting him.

After completing the story he asked Jo to go to sleep but Jo asked her father to tell him another story tomorrow where the wizard must hit Roger Skunk's mother over the head with his wand. Jack explained to her that because Roger skunk loved his mother more than the company of any other animal, he was better off with his old smell.

Jack went down without answering her and sat on a chair and watched his wife repaint the room. He saw the molding in their house as a cage surrounding him and his wife and he did not feel the desire to help her.

ANSWERS

1. What is the moral issue that the story raises?

The story raises a very sensitive issue of a child and a father's perspective of thinking. The narrator asks parents to help them to achieve a goal, not to establish the authority of being elder and experienced. If a child has a different goal that she/he wants to continue, the parents should not create an obstacle to achieve the same. The parents must be cooperative and let the child decide his/her future in their way.

2. How does Jo want the story to end and why?

Jo wants the story to end in a different way. She wants the wizard to hit the mother and not to restore the previous smell because Skunk was very happy with this rose smell. She simply says that a child must have the right to choose his/her career. The parents have only the right to support them, not to decide the future of their children.

3. Why does Jack insist that it was the wizard that was hit and not the mother?

Jack is the father of Jo and he is a very protective and caring father. He is a man of traditional thinking and believes that parents must have the right to decide the future of their children. He is not aware of modern culture. Therefore, he positively takes the mother and supports her blindly when she hits the wizard and asks her to restore the previous smell.

4. What is your stance regarding the two endings to the Roger Skunk story?

Both, two endings are good as per the different perspectives of thinking.
